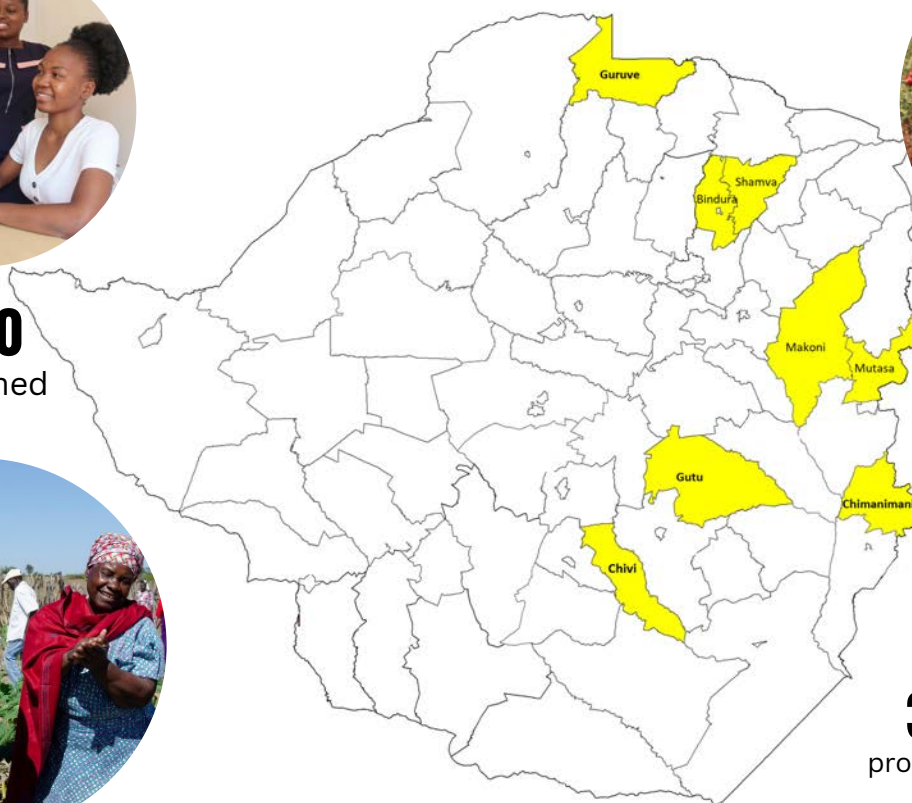
Development Aid from People to People in Zimbabwe (DAPP) is a Private Voluntary Organisation registered in Zimbabwe in June 1980 as a Welfare organisation under the Ministry of Labour and Social Welfare. DAPP's registration number is W.O. 22/80. DAPP in Zimbabwe complements the government efforts through implementing short and long-term development project activities in education, farming, community development and health.

Our work in communities is people centered with the people as the driving force in development.

In 2022 we implemented 14 development projects in three provinces: Mashonaland Central, Manicaland and Masvingo.

SUSTAINABLE AGRICULTURE & ENVIRONMENT

Smallholder farmers play a crucial role in establishing sustainable food systems locally, fighting hunger and malnutrition in their communities.

Through our Farmers' Clubs and Communal to Commercial Farmer models, we work together with smallholder farmers and women in organized groups to enhance agricultural production through use of climate information to manage climate-induced risks. This is complemented by promoting the adoption of climate-resilient agricultural practices, cropping systems, reduction of carbon emissions, and re-forestation.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Our Community Development programmes take place in communities where life needs to improve. We support social cohesion and together we find opportunities to create progress.

Together with the Village Action Groups, we amplify the voices of the children to advocate against child abuse, drug abuse and domestic violence. We promote economic strengthening for women and youth through Internal Savings and Lending clubs (ISALs).

COOK-STOVES PROJECT

In 2022, we started implementing a Firewood Saving Cookstove project in order to reduce the rate of deforestation locally.

The project is currently operating in Makoni, Mutasa and Chimanimani districts and targeting 60,000 households. The project aims to reduce carbon intake by humans to improve the health and well-being of women & children (most commonly the cooks of their households), by reducing exposure to toxic off-gassing and dangerous matter in biomass smoke.

DAPP's health programmes aim to save people's lives through targeted health interventions and end the inequalities perpetuating the epidemics in Mashonaland Central and Manicaland provinces.

Our health programmes HOPE Bindura and TC TB Makoni, collaborate with the Ministry of Health and Child Care to end global malaria, TB and HIV and to contribute to reaching the UNAIDS 95-95-95 targets.

Our approach is community centred and people led as it organises, supports and strengthens people's responsive capacities.

Education is the foundation for peace, solidarity, inclusiveness and sustainable development.

DAPP Zimbabwe through Vocational skills training is giving many young people, including adolescent girls and young women (AGYW), opportunities to access education to create a livelihood for themselves and their families and become competitive in the job market. Through Public Private Partnerships (PPP), we are making advances in Technical Vocation Education and Training (TVET) training to bridge the gap between training content, market demands thus promoting employment opportunities

HUMANITARIAN INTERVENTION

DAPP Zimbabwe is currently implementing the Humanitarian Action Post-Disaster Recovery and Disaster Risk Reduction in ward 6 and 9 of Chimanimani district in the Manicaland Province. The project supports socioeconomic recovery of 800 families so that they can get back on their feet with renewed capacity to meet their basic needs. The families who are mainly smallholder farmers, organized themselves in community-based structures where they learn and share ideas in sustainable conservation farming techniques and small livestock production and water management techniques.
